They can be used to summarize what's in a chapter
• Or to set the scene • Or to highlight key points*

UPPERCASE WORDS ON the opening line can look quite dignified and some people prefer them to dropcaps. Another feature on this page is the placement of the folio (that's the fancy name for "page number") as it appears in the bottom-center of the page, a traditional placement for it on a new chapter.
